Bee Happy ...

... Not only is it spring (so says the calendar, anyway), but we are taking delivery of 2 "packages" of bees at our Nichols Preserve in April. That's one queen and 3,000 workers per "package". Alas, all of our bees died last year – one from Colony Collapse Disorder, and the others from human or animal tampering.



We narrow our hive openings in winter, so that it's less cold and rodents can't get in. And, we leave them with substantial honey for food. Even so, it's difficult for the bees to survive in this strange weather. They need to get out and forage in good weather, but it's single file through the reduced opening, and they often die of hypothermia if they can't get back in time. Or, if enough of them can't get back to create sufficient heat for the rest to survive. Lucinda Harriss and Jenni Freedman are monitoring our progress, but we need a few more "Bee Angels" to help fund this effort.
